
Come! live in the light! Shine with the joy and the love of the Lord! We are called to be light for the kingdom, to live in the freedom of the city of God!

We Are Called by David Haas is one of our newer hymns. I don't know about you but it is a hymn that pulls me in and lifts me up. It does lead to some questions though. What are we being called to here at Bethlehem? What are we being called to as individuals or families? The answer is given in the refrain: We are called to act with justice. We are called to love tenderly. We are called to serve one another, to walk humbly with God. As Bethlehem continues on what our council president Jerry Johns calls our "New Journey," I hope we can make that refrain our theme—justice, loving, serving, and walking humbly with God. Food, for the journey both

wanted to go on, can you? Abraham and Sarah didn't even know where they were going. Noah and his family were saved but it was not by going on a cruise. Joseph went to Egypt as a slave and Israel journeyed out of slavery in Egypt hundreds of years later, but it took them 40 years to travel a few hundred miles. Do you really think Mary and Joseph wanted to journey right before Mary gave birth? And what about that last journey to Jerusalem for Jesus. Many of our journey's we don't choose...and many are downright hard.

So, how is our "New Journey" going? I know some are asking how our financial situation is. Please ask a council person any questions you have. I can say, it's about the same, we're holding our own but continue to explore the recommendations of the Futuring Task Force to increase ministry sustainability. Those suggestions were: renting space, reevaluating staffing, Food Pantry Partnerships, and sharing our space with another church. We've discovered no other churches or entities that wish to share or rent space. First Lutheran Church has some members who have expressed interest in helping to maintain our community garden and have even talked of the possibility of enlarging it to produce more food for the pantry. Our staffing remains the same as we are definitely not overstaffed. We are keeping our ears open for the possibility of perhaps sharing our pastor with another church or ministry. It may not be ideal but it may open new doors for mission and ministry. Verse two of this favorite hymn goes like this: *Come! Open your heart! Show your mercy to all those in fear! We are called to be hope for the hopeless, so all hatred and blindness will be no more!* Journeys are not necessarily something we would choose to go on but they are before us. As we open our hearts to one another and to all who come through our doors we continue to work for justice, love tenderly, serve one another and humbly seek God.
