Explanation of Budget Allocations and Assumptions:

Income

- Regular Giving allocation is based on 2024 giving patterns. This line item will need Α. to be watched carefully during 2025 in order to cover the proposed expenses.
- В. Family Service Agency - Club 55 annual lease income totals \$22510
- C. Mission Endowment Fund funds need to balance the overall proposed budget total \$45,000 for 2025. Just for reference, for 2024 \$45,000 MEF allocation was needed to balance our projected spending plan this year and we are on track.
- Other Ministry Support is for miscellaneous funds received; for example, D. for donations for use of our building or funding for a special project.

Expenses

Partnership For Food Pantry staff coordinator salary and food purchases. Synod Mission

Support is no longer a budgeted item; funds at year-end are reviewed for

making a possible allocation to the Northern Illinois Synod.

For 2025, our People spending plan does not incorporate a called pastor. People
